Early Deadline for High School Applicants

Approximately **\$120,000** is awarded based on need and artistic merit. Thanks to a generous gift from the estate of Gladys and Phillip Haddad, this is an increase of 150% over previous scholarships.

Deadline: applications are due Wednesday, **January 16, 2026** @ 11:59pm. Note: this is the early deadline for current high school students only.

Eligibility: Current high school Senior and prospective full-time incoming freshmen ART majors seeking seeking a BA in Studio Art or Design are eligible to apply. To be considered for need-based awards, CSU must have a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on file.

Conditions: All scholarship recipients must:

- Declare ART as a major when applying and during the scholarship period.
- Enroll full-time (minimum of 12 credit hours per semester) at CSU.
- Enroll in at least one ART course per semester.
- Maintain a minimum 2.5 grade point average (GPA) overall, and a minimum 3.0 GPA in ART.
- Participate fully in a departmental student group, the Student Organization of Fine Art (SOFA) or the student chapter of the American Institute of Graphic Arts (CSU AIGA).
- Studio majors: Present work created during the scholarship period in a public exhibition in the spring semester (*Current CSU students only, incoming freshmen are exempted*).
- Design majors: Acceptable projects may include but are not limited to leadership in AIGA events, initiatives, and activities, as well as design-based projects that might serve the concentration or department. Projects/activities must be approved by design faculty.

Prepare 6 high quality digital images of 6 works of art you have created in the past 12 months. Each image file should be a JPG no larger than 2MB.

- Fill out all required fields including name, contact info, and school info.
- Provide the name and email of a High School teacher to provide a recommendation.
- Upload your work samples and include the requested information including title, medium, dimensions, and date completed.
- Upload a brief statement about your work and your artistic objectives.
- Click the SUBMIT button at the bottom.

Previously submitted works, original art objects, unsolicited items and incomplete applications will not be considered.

One half of the scholarship award is applied to Fall semester tuition. Students must pass a scholarship review and consult with Merit Scholarship Advisor before registering for Spring semester to receive the second half of the award.

Special Instructions for Video and Time-based Artwork

Video Links: Video submissions must be uploaded to a video sharing site. This may include video, performance, interactive, motion graphics, animation, websites or video documentation of artwork.

- After the contact information fields, there is an optional field for links to video work posted online. *Copy and Paste* the links to this field.
- Use high-quality, publicly available video hosting service such as Vimeo or YouTube. Test the links to make sure they work and are viewable by anyone. Deadlinks and low-quality videos will not be considered.
- You may submit up to 3 links. The combined length of all video samples should be no more than 5 minutes. No more than 3 links, and no more than 5 minutes of video will be considered.
- Consider creating a single short demo reel of your time-base and/or video work that is no longer than 5 minutes long.

Images: Image uploads are required for Studio & Design submissions.

- Create still screen shots of your time-based work to upload.
- In the image information make it clear in the Media field that the work is video or time-based.
- In the Dimensions field, include the duration (ex. 6 min, 24 sec).
- You may also indicate physical dimensions (H x W x D) if applicable.
