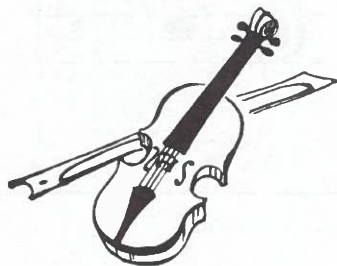

## Performers and Presenters

**City Six Strings** was founded in 2020 by Cleveland State University alumni Sarah Becker and McKinley Glasser. Since then, the ensemble has grown to accommodate performances at hundreds of events per year throughout Ohio from concerts and fundraisers to weddings and galas. They believe string music is for all, no matter the genre or venue.

**Dr. Attila Kenyeres** is a researcher of media manipulation and fake news, university lecturer, teacher of history, former political and public journalist, press officer, television reporter, and TV news presenter from Hungary. He has published a book entitled "Falsified reality – the secrets of media manipulation". In 2017, as the only Hungarian journalist, he won the Study of the U.S. Institute on media and journalism scholarship to Ohio University. In 2021, as a Fulbright visiting scholar, he taught a university course called "Fake News and Media Manipulation in Hungary and East Central Europe" at the University of Pittsburgh.

**The Hungarian Scout Folk Ensemble** was formed in 1973 to organize a group that studies Hungarian culture in the "grass roots" sense of the word. The aim of the group was and is to preserve dying folk arts of the Hungarians living in the Carpathian basin; to search out the arts, make them their own, and present them to their viewing audiences.
